

Note: This journal is recorded by Israel Gauntt, son of Uz Gauntt of Haninicon (most of this property was sold to Pierre Lorillard for what became Rancocas Stables) in Springfield, NJ. The journal ends in 1827, the year that Israel died – he was 30 years old and died very suddenly. There are many pages that have not yet been typed; this journal will be updated with additional pages as time permits.

The spelling, grammar, and punctuation have been recorded directly from the original journal. What could not be deciphered includes a question mark. Note that “&c” is the same as etc.

The Gauntt family was Quaker and entries show day of the week in numeric from 1 – 7 and are recorded as – for example: 6d-7<sup>th</sup> of May – note that this notation does not appear in each entry.

## 1823

9<sup>th</sup> of January – Benjamin Gauntt (and Ben Uz)

Israel Gauntt Burnt bush in the fore noon and in the afternoon I whent to Ephrem Areson weading “&c.

10<sup>th</sup> of January I made bares burls shoe and picked fowls.

11<sup>th</sup> of January I whent to burlington to take the fowls

12<sup>th</sup> of January Benjamin Gauntt and Suzanah Gauntt was here and whent home in the afternoon and Hannah Gaunt and Elisabeth Jones and Israel Gauntt whent to Samuel Gauntt this same day in the afternoon.

13<sup>th</sup> of January I whent in the pines and Brought a load of pine

14<sup>th</sup> of January I brought a load of pine in the forenoon and in the afternoon Mary Stockton Ann Stockton and Faith Stockton came here and I had the pleasure of walking home with them

15<sup>th</sup> of January in the forenoon I carted ha and in the afternoon sawd with the crascut and Samuel Gauntt come over to see us this day of 15<sup>th</sup> of mo 1823

16<sup>th</sup> of January I took a loag to frenches mill, Hannah Gauntt came to see us in the afternoon this same day 16<sup>th</sup> 1823

17<sup>th</sup> of January I tok a loag to frenches mill in the afternoon Hannah Gauntt and Mercy, Scott, Amy Arenson they came to see us. I whent with them ...

18<sup>th</sup> of January I Hannah Gauntt and Israel Gauntt whent down to burlingtoun with poaltry and called to see Samuel Shinn as whe came back and called at Samuel Gauntts in the afternoon

19<sup>th</sup> of January I went to Burlington and came home and in the evening I went to pay a certain girl a religious visit "&c.

20<sup>th</sup> of January it rained all day very fast  
I did not do much of any thing this day but salt beef "&c.

21<sup>st</sup> of January I took a calf to Burlington for Benjamin Gauntt "&c.

22<sup>th</sup> of January I rebuilt cornracks and went to Jobestons store "&c.

23<sup>rd</sup> of January I made brooms and in the evening I went over to Samuel Gauntts to let him know about pockets preaching the 24<sup>th</sup> of the mo. 1823

24<sup>th</sup> of January I took a load of straw over in the Sudrick field for the catel and load some barpoast and set in one gate poast and other thing too tedious to mention &c.

25<sup>th</sup> of January I went down to Burlington and brought up Benjamin's gig and a wild goose with it. Left it at Samuel Gauntts brought the goose home and had some fun in eating it. Snowed and rained all day "&c.

26<sup>th</sup> of January I did nothing but eat wild geese, very cloudy all day &c.

27<sup>th</sup> of January I went down to Burlington and took lamb ??? to Mr. Fennemore and came back by black horse and brought gumbo my dog &c.

28<sup>th</sup> of January I hewed ??? poasts and went over to Samuel Gauntts in the evening to see my friends and particulars &c.

29<sup>th</sup> of January I squared barpoast &c.

30<sup>th</sup> of January I took Samuel Shinns broad-ax home and from there to Joseph Smiths and from there to Samuel Gauntt and from there home &c.

31<sup>st</sup> of January I built cowstands &c.

Snowed in the evening about to track a rabbit, cleared up very cold by 8 o'clock in the evening

1<sup>st</sup> of February 1823

I went to mount Holly mill and in the evening went over to Samuel Gauntts to pay a visit &c.

2<sup>nd</sup> of February I had Anna Stockton Sarah Stockton Sarah Wornor (Horner??) Elizabeth Horner Elizabeth Horner John Hornors wife they all came to see me I Gauntt I suspect I waited on them with pleasure I will assure &c.

3<sup>rd</sup> of february I whent down to Burlingtoun in the slay and in my travels I found a very nice girl and took her a slaying with pleasure &c.

4<sup>th</sup> of february I helped cleand (cleared?) ry and whent down to jobstown, John Pancoast Isack Conner and Benjamin Pancoast Henry Bainbridge came here &c.

5<sup>th</sup> of february I whent down to S Shinn and from thense to the three tuns and from thense to the square and from thense to the Blackhorse and then home

6<sup>th</sup> of february I whent to jobstown and did not do mutch els but tok care of the horeses in the evening verry coald indeed this day &c.

7<sup>th</sup> of february Samuel Shinn and my self whent to pay Dick Cook a visit &c.

8<sup>th</sup> of february Adim Manovaren and J Honor and my self whent to Blackhorse to setel some of that dispute that lays betwixt Dick and co &c.

9<sup>th</sup> of february Murcy Cott Hannah Gauntt Samuel Gauntt all came here to see me I suspect

10<sup>th</sup> of february I whent down to Burlington to see Benjamin Gauntt and Susan Gauntt and from thense to Samuel Gauntt and then home &c.

11<sup>th</sup> of february Samuel Shinn and my self whent down to mount holly and then hence and then had the pleasure of paying a certain girl a religious visit &c. snowed and rained in the evening

12<sup>th</sup> of february I did nothing els but whent to jobstown and take care of the horses &c.

13<sup>th</sup> of february I whent down to mount holly Cort (Cart??) &c. snowed in the evening

14<sup>th</sup> of february I split wood in the fore noon and in the after noon it rained haild snowd &c. Asa Shinn came her to pay us a religious visit Benjamin Gauntt too &c.

15<sup>th</sup> of february Asa Shinn and myself whent down to mount holly Cort (Cart??) &c.

16<sup>th</sup> of february Asa Shinn and myself whent to pay Copany meeting a visit in the gig and from thense to Samuel Shinn and then I took my gig to Samuel Gauntt and then home &c.

17<sup>th</sup> of february took a load of loags to frenches mill and took 2 horses to the blacksmiths to get there shouse shifted &c.

18<sup>th</sup> of february I whent to trentown after flax &c.

19<sup>th</sup> of february I whent to frenches mill to take a load of loagues in the fore noon an in the after noon I whent to Samuel Shinn and from thense to Samuel Gauntt and then home &c.

20<sup>th</sup> of february I whent to Samuel Shinn and then to mount holly Court and then to Samuel Gauntt and then home, rained all day &c.

21<sup>st</sup> of february I cleand rye and helpd castrate the lambs and in the evening whent over to Samuel Gaunts

22<sup>nd</sup> of february I took 30 bushels of rye to mount holly and then home and the rest to tedious to mention So mutch of it

23<sup>rd</sup> of february Snowd all day verry good laying snow indeed. I did nothing els but take care of the horses &c.

24<sup>th</sup> of february Snowed all day I presume this snow storme lasted 8 and 40 hours this snow is abought 18 inches deep I carted logs and helped dress one horse and in the evening I whent to pay Samuel Gauntts family a religious visit. &c.

25<sup>th</sup> of february I whent to Samuel Shinn and from thense to Samuel Gauntt and then home

26<sup>th</sup> of february I whent to mount holly and in the afternoon I and Samuel Shinn whent to white hill ?? and to Slabtown

27<sup>th</sup> of february I wehnt to Joshua Forsythe and then home

28<sup>th</sup> of february me and Asa Shinn whent in to east jersey and ind ???

1<sup>st</sup> of march I came home in the slay rele parade of folkese here

2<sup>nd</sup> of march I whent to Jobstown and then I had the pleasure of paying a certain girl a religious visit and then home then I came against everything will and every thing els &c.

3<sup>rd</sup> of march 1823 I carried my plow to the blacksmith in jobstown and then came home John Bisshap and Isaac Hormer (Homer??) came here in the afternoon to pay me a visit I suspect &c.

4<sup>th</sup> of march I undertook to blow ?? 1 log but did not succeed. William Fox and his wife hester came here to see us &c.

5<sup>th</sup> of march I whent to mount holly mill to get a grist and then to slabtown then home Samuel Gauntt and his wife Hannah Gauntt came here to pay us a visit. Warm day, it is true

6<sup>th</sup> of march rained all day I did not do any thing of any account but go over to to pay Samuel Gauntts family a visit I came home as I should doo

7<sup>th</sup> of march I went to Samuel Shinn and Stevens Combs vandue and then home

8<sup>th</sup> of march I trimb treas and then commenced bloing that log and it came out a blur verry warm day this true &c.

9<sup>th</sup> of march I went to Samuel Shinn and from thense to Samuel Gauntt and then home Benjamin Gauntt and Susan Gauntt his wife was here to se us the rest to tedious to mention &c.

10<sup>th</sup> of march I played brandy wicked in the medder ??? and the rest to tedious to mention whe all now Benjamin Gauntt took one calf away

11<sup>th</sup> of march trimb treas of all limds and I went to town meeten rained all the after noon and parte of the night

12<sup>th</sup> of march I went to mount holly and to Rachel Butcher vandue and then home the rest to tedious to mention &c.

13<sup>th</sup> of march I went to Blackhorse then to slabtown from thense to amose Zillys vendue from thense home &c.

14<sup>th</sup> of march I plowd some for the first it began to reign. Continue on reigning all day. all I have done this day is to tedious to mention. this is just and true &c.

15<sup>th</sup> of march I burnt brush in the forenoon and in the afternoon I went to Samuel Gauntts and to jobstown, verry windy day:| blustering

16<sup>th</sup> of march I did nothing but take care of the horses and spark a girl

17<sup>th</sup> of march I plowd all day & David vandue came here

18<sup>th</sup> of march rained all day verry fast; I went over to Samuel Gauntts in the afternoon: the wind blowd the fences over in the afternoon: I went to jobstown two &c.

19<sup>th</sup> of march I plowd the wind blowd verry fast all day whe all verrwell know &c.

20<sup>th</sup> of march I went to jobstown and then to Samuel Gauntts then home: snowd all day: the snow whe thought to be 12 inches deep good measure &c.

21<sup>st</sup> of march I went to Blackhorse to J Darkhouse and then home &c.

22 of march I went to Blackhorse after some nales and then home and in the afternoon I went to jobstown: Isaac Horner Charles Robins came here &c.

23<sup>rd</sup> of march I had the pleasure of paying a certain girl a religious visit &c.

24<sup>th</sup> of march I set out trees of all kinds & Benjamin Gauntt took 2 calfs away: hurto came here to make shoose & Joseph Darkhouse came here to bild me one mesbox: very windy day indeed that is curtain &c.

25<sup>th</sup> of march I naild on slats: tok cabage out of the hole: plant onions: parsnips & tok care of the horses: Hannah Gauntt Murcy Scott came here to se us: I had the pleasure of walking home with them & Thomas Siks was here to se us

26<sup>th</sup> of march I planted unions and other garden truck snowd and raind and haild all day and all night & I whent to jobstown in the afternoon &c.

27<sup>th</sup> of march I whent to Benjamin Jones mill and from thense to jobstown then home &c.

28<sup>th</sup> of march I whent to frenches mill from thense to slabtown then home & Samuel Gauntt came here to se us

29<sup>th</sup> of march I carted that locus tree home from the barton place and tok care of the horses

30<sup>th</sup> of march snowd and raind all day and all night and the 31<sup>st</sup> until 10:00 snowd all this time and raind I had the pleasure of pay a certain girl a religious visit in the evening

31<sup>st</sup> of march I remade fence in the afternoon and took care of the horses Thomas Black came to se us on business

1<sup>st</sup> of Apriel I remade fence and whent to jobstown in the evening Elizabeth Jones came to assist Hannah the 30<sup>th</sup> the wind blowd the fences all over more so than common &c.

11<sup>th</sup> of Apriele I plowd in verry cold wind &c.

12<sup>th</sup> of Apriel I whent down to Burlingtoun and from thense to Blackhorse and then to S Gauntts and then home & and then (writer crossed out remaining words)

13<sup>th</sup> of Apriel I had the pleasure of paying a certain girl a religious visit &c.

14<sup>th</sup> of Apriel I whent to trentown and from thense home & Hannah A Gauntt came here to se us &c.

15<sup>th</sup> of Apriel I plougd &c.

16<sup>th</sup> of Apriel I plougd &c.

17<sup>th</sup> of Apriel I ploughd & verry warm day indeed

18<sup>th</sup> of Apriel I ploughd & in the evening I whent over to Samuel Gauntt

19<sup>th</sup> of Apriel I ploughd and in the evening I whent to jobstown &c.

20<sup>th</sup> of Apriel I whent to mount holly and fromthense to Samuel Gauntt and then home &c.

21<sup>st</sup> of Apriel I ploughd all day. reighn some this day but not much

22<sup>nd</sup> of Apriel I set out locustreas and ploughd some but not mutch &c.

23<sup>rd</sup> of Apriel I ploughd & reingn some but not mutch & the wind blew the fences over but not mutch &c.

24<sup>th</sup> of Apriel I ploughed & Benjamin Gauntt tok 2 calf away & verry coald indeed &c.

25<sup>th</sup> of Apriel I ploughed & Rheuben Gauntt came here to see us in a Dearborn &c.

26<sup>th</sup> of Apriel I ploughed &c.

27<sup>th</sup> of Apriel I whent over to Samuel Gauntt's in the evening & Thomas Harres and his wife Mary? Harrres and Mary Harres his daughter came here to pay us a visit &c.

28<sup>th</sup> of Apriel I ploughd & reighnd some but not mutch of any account &c.

29<sup>th</sup> of Apriel I plougd &c.

30<sup>th</sup> of Apriel I ploughd & in the evening whent to Jobstown &c.

1<sup>st</sup> of May I ploughd & it tride to reghn but could not mak out mutch \_\_\_\_\_ it &c.  
To place 9 figures and make them count 15 every way

2<sup>nd</sup> of may I ploughd &c.

3<sup>rd</sup> of may I whent to Burlingtown and from thens home

4<sup>th</sup> of may Benjamin Gauntt and Susen Gaunt his wife came here to pay us a visit & in the evening I whent over to Samuel Gauntts

5<sup>th</sup> of may I ploughd & Hannah Gauntt came here to see us

6<sup>th</sup> of may I ploughd &c.

7<sup>th</sup> of may I ploughd & reighnd some in the forenoon in the afternoon Samuel Shinn came here to see us &c.

8<sup>th</sup> of may I ploughd & reighnd considerable this day &c.

9<sup>th</sup> of may I ploughd &c.

10<sup>th</sup> of may I ploughd & Hannah Gauntt came here to see us

11<sup>th</sup> of may had the pleasure of paying a certain girl a visit

12<sup>th</sup> of may I ploughd

13<sup>th</sup> of may Samuel Shinn and my self whent to Blackhorse & in the evening I whent to jobstown. Stormb all day fast

14<sup>th</sup> of may I ploughd and in the evening I whent over to Samuel Gauntts – Peter Gauntt left here on fourth day &c.

15<sup>th</sup> of may I ploughd and helpd load one load of bark &c.

16<sup>th</sup> of may I ploughd & reighnd some this day in the afternoon but not mutch &c.

17<sup>th</sup> of may I ploughd & reighnd some in the morning a light shower &c.

18<sup>th</sup> of may I whent over to pay S Gauntt a visit

19<sup>th</sup> of may I whent to mount holly and from thense to Burlingtown there put up for night

29<sup>th</sup> of may I harrowed in the forenoon and in the afternoon reighnd verry fast – what whe may call a soaking reighn in the evening I whent to jobstown

30<sup>th</sup> of may I shoveld manure

31<sup>st</sup> of may I whent to Samuel Shinns he and me whent to mount holly then home then to augustin Tallmans from thense home &c.



1<sup>st</sup> of june I whent afternoon to Samuel Gauntt's first of the weak &c.

2<sup>nd</sup> of june I haried corn &c.

3<sup>rd</sup> of june I haried corn

4<sup>th</sup> of june I haried corn

5<sup>th</sup> of june I carted menure &c.

6<sup>th</sup> of june ii carted menuer &c.

7<sup>th</sup> of june I carted in some manure in the morning & then I took the 2 hannah Gauntts to Burlington, a shoping there I found Peter Gauntt brot him home with us &c.

8<sup>th</sup> of june I whent to jogston to pay for my coatt & Miss Ann Baid came here to live on this day the first of the weak 1823 – rained some to day

9<sup>th</sup> of june whe began to plow corn I spread menuer until breckfist time then I plought the rest part of the day verry all day indeed  
Cold a naugh to ware stockings all day

10<sup>th</sup> of june I ploughd & verry cule evening I whent to jobston in the evening &c.

11<sup>th</sup> of june I ploughd & verry cule evening

12<sup>th</sup> of june I ploughd & cule evening indeed

13<sup>th</sup> of june I ploughd corn

14<sup>th</sup> of june I ploughd corn & verry warm

15<sup>th</sup> of june Samuel Shinn and myself whent to settle some of our business in Mansfield

16<sup>th</sup> of june I ploughd corn &c.

17<sup>th</sup> of june I ploughd corn and in the evening I whent over to Samuel Gauntts to see them

18<sup>th</sup> of june I ploughd corn & warm day

19<sup>th</sup> of june I whent and brought 1 load of cantten (cotton?) home from frenches mill & and tok 1 wagon whele to jobstown to get the hoop shut & whe began to mo this day

20<sup>th</sup> of june I whent and tok 4 ? logs to frenches mill & and brought some scantton home & then mend some rakes for use

21<sup>st</sup> of June I hauled 1 load of stone home from Samuel Newboald mount & in the afternoon I worked amongst the hay. Murcy Scott and Hannah Gauntt came here to pay us a visit & dry weather

22 of June rained some but not much of went over to Samuel Gauntts & from thence to Sarah Atkinson & I had the pleasure of sparking a girl before I came home.

23<sup>th</sup> of June I karded hay karded 2 loads of dirt

24<sup>th</sup> of June I went to mount holly after some salt then home & I karded hay in the afternoon &c.

25<sup>th</sup> of June I karded hay

26<sup>th</sup> of June I karded 1 load of hay & haried corn butcherd one seep & rained moast all the afternoon rained some in the evening &

Asa Gaskill Moses Karter Garrit Mathues Joseph Gaskill Anthony Abelgit Thomas Emens Nathaniel Karter Samuel Bayley Joseph Darcas William Hurto and others

27<sup>th</sup> of June I haried korn & we had a verry smart shower of rain in the evening & Hannah Gauntt came here to pay us a visit

28<sup>th</sup> of June I haried korn in the fore noon and in the afternoon I worked abought the hay

29<sup>th</sup> of June I went over to Blackhorse to get my coat made and in the afternoon I went to pay Murcy Stockton a visit Job Stockton a visit &c.

30<sup>th</sup> of June I haried korn and karded hay – we began to reap this day

The first of July I made hay and karded hay

2<sup>nd</sup> of July I karded ha in the forenoon & 4 or 5 showers of rane in the afternoon hards as it could pore down &c.

3<sup>rd</sup> of July I plought korn in the forenoon and in the afternoon I made hay

4<sup>th</sup> of July I karded hay and reaped some & we made a finish of the hay this day

5<sup>th</sup> of July I plought korn, Rheuben Gauntt and Peter Gauntt came here to see us &c.

6<sup>th</sup> of July I went to the square from thence to Blackhorse from thence to Slabtown & I had the pleasure of paying a certain girl a visit & Isac Barton came here to see us this day

7<sup>th</sup> of July I plought korn in the forenoon, and in the afternoon rained very hard until night. More water fell this day then has lately at 1 time this is true &c.

8<sup>th</sup> of July I helped reap & we made a finish of reaping & this day & Hannah Gauntt came over here to see us. I had the pleasure of walking home with her &c.

9<sup>th</sup> of July I ploughed in the forenoon and in the afternoon I karded rye in the barn &c.

10<sup>th</sup> of July I ploughed korn some in the fore part of the day and then karded rye the rest part of the day &c.

11<sup>th</sup> of July I karded rye in the barn and made a finish of it. Compleat Samuel Gauntt helped to finish the rye &c.

12<sup>th</sup> of July I ploughed in the forenoon and in the afternoon I helped Samuel Gauntt karte rye in the barn &c.

13<sup>th</sup> of July I went to gravesvil to see the girls then came home in time (two words I cannot decipher) my coat came to town this day of our lord 1823

14<sup>th</sup> of July I helped Samuel Gauntt karte rye in the barn. We made a finish of it &c.

15<sup>th</sup> of July I ploughed potatoes &c. we had a smart shower of rain &c. the rest too tedious to mention

16<sup>th</sup> of July I ploughed potatoes in the forenoon and in the afternoon I harrowed korn &c.

17<sup>th</sup> of July I harrowed korn &c.  
Hannah Gauntt Murcy Scott came over to see us

18<sup>th</sup> of July I went to moutholly mill and from thence home &c. rained all day fast indeed &c.

19<sup>th</sup> of July I went O then to Burlington then back to O then home &c. Benjamin Gauntts first boy came to town this day &c.  
7<sup>th</sup> of the week 1823

20<sup>th</sup> of July I went over to Samuel Gauntts from thence home &c.

21<sup>st</sup> of July I went over to Samuel Newbold mount after 2 loads stone this day &c.  
Henry Bankridge came here to see us

22<sup>nd</sup> of July I karded one load of stone from the mount & and in the afternoon I karded dirt to put on the stone & Sheriff Erl came here to see us this day July 23 1823

23 of July I ploughed potatoes the last time &c.

24<sup>th</sup> of July I went down to dunces ferry after sturging &c. I brought one for Samuel Gauntt &c.

Henry Banebridge came here to make show and mend &c.

25<sup>th</sup> of July I ploughed potatoes in the forepart of the day then it began to rain and rained all day I did not hurt myself this the rest too tedious to mention &c.

26<sup>th</sup> of July I went to Jobstown after 2 plows, then finished plowing the potatoes, and in the afternoon I went to Jobstown again &c.

Rained same this day &c.

27<sup>th</sup> of July I went to Jobstown and home and as I went over to Samuel Gauntt's then home &c.

I had the pleasure of sparking a girl this evening &c.

28<sup>th</sup> of July plowed fallow (fallow) for the first &c.

hutch (?) Fenimore took some lambs away &c. William Smith came here to see us. Guner William &c.

29<sup>th</sup> of July I plowed fallow &c. rain some this day a very small some to &c. warm day among the Irish

30<sup>th</sup> of July I ploughed fallow & Hannah Newbold Rachel Newbold Rocky Willcot came here to see us

31<sup>st</sup> of July I and others too tedious to mention went in the pines after huckleberries but did not get none this is true enough &c.

The first of August I ploughed fallow &c.

Rheuben Gauntt and Peter Gauntt came here to see us Peter was very sick indeed

2<sup>nd</sup> of August I ploughed fallow in the forenoon, and in the afternoon Jefferson and I went to Browns mill a fishing with our hooks &c.

3<sup>rd</sup> of August Samuel Shinn Isaac Shinn and Sarah Shinn Sarah Shinn and Sarah's niece Hannah Shinn came here to see us & for my part I had the pleasure of sparking one girl that evening &c. We had one smart shower of rain in the afternoon

4<sup>th</sup> of August I ploughed fallow &c. Hannah Gauntt came here to see us John Stokes also &c. Warm day

5<sup>th</sup> of August I ploughed fallow in the forenoon and in the afternoon I went to Mountholly from thence to Sarah Atkinsons then home

The reverent Mr. Tommy (?) Newboald came here to pay us a visit & rained a few drops this day  
Samuel Gauntt came over here to see us &c.

6<sup>th</sup> of August I ploughed fallow grown, warm day

7<sup>th</sup> of August I ploughed fallow in the forenoon and in the afternoon I went to moutholly  
Isak Hanner came here to layber &c.

8<sup>th</sup> of August I ploughed fallow &c. Sam C Gauntt and Hannah Gauntt his wife came here  
and took Hannah Gauntt to Burlingtown &c. warm day indeed this is true

9<sup>th</sup> of August Jefferson and I went up to Browns mill a fishing &c.

10<sup>th</sup> of August cloudy day and some rain fell

11<sup>th</sup> of August I ploughed fallow we had a clover rain this day &c.

12<sup>th</sup> of August I ploughed some but not much rained by showers this day &c. Israel  
Gauntt

13<sup>th</sup> of August I ploughed in the forenoon and in the afternoon, rained fast indeed great rain  
this is true we all know &c.

14<sup>th</sup> of August I went down to moutholly to take a grist &c. then went in to court &c.

15<sup>th</sup> of August I ploughed fallow &c.

16<sup>th</sup> of August rained most all day, I did nothing of any consequence but sleep &c.
